#### 8 Finance report

The treasurer (GS) presented the finance report as at 30<sup>th</sup> June 2024. (Copy attached) and thanked William Adams Pty Ltd accountants who had assisted in preparation of the financial reports. Please note that the accounts are not independently audited, as we are not required to under CAV due to our low turnover.

### 9 Membership report

G.Slocombe gave account of membership status, reminding those present that the definition of Chapter 19 member is someone that is a financial member of ACMOC and has confirmed they wish to be associated with, and receive correspondence from Chapter 19. ACMOC financial members can be members of more than one Chapter.

The Chapter 19 currently has 152 members that were financial with ACMOC (up from 146 same time last year), of which the breakdown is as follows.

- Vic = 100 (+8)
- NSW = 21 (+1)
- SA = 18 (-2)
- Tas = 8(-1)
- ACT = 1
- QLD = 4 (+1)
- UK 0 (-1)

There were 11 Chapter memberships that expired as at 30 JUNE 2024 year that have not been renewed. This is same as last year. We expect with follow up a number will renew shortly.

There are 276 (up 11 from prior year) financial ACMOC members in Australia distributed as follows.

- NT = 1 (-1)
- QLD = 44 (-4)
- SA = 41 (+7)
- TAS = 9 (-1)
- Vic = 102 (+10)
- WA = 22 (+3)

Not surprising areas sates served by active Chapter's 19 & 30 has the most growth in membership.

Of all financial members in Vic & Tas, only 3 financial members have not responded to correspondence to also join Chapter 19.

Glen thanked Phil Hughes for his assistance in ringing members that were overdue.

There have been some challenges, and confusion in relation to the transition across to the new ZOHO online payment system and auto-renewals and I have been active to help the Club's administration resolve these throughout the year.

A reminder the preference is for members to renew directly via the Club's website, however the I can still manually process memberships on annual basis if need be.

	Stock levels have therefore deliberately been increased this year and closed at \$15,226.45	
	R.Burns asked about additional merch lines similar to those displayed at the 'Cat Store' where the AGM was hosted. G.Slocombe advised that ACMOC can buy wholesale from Cat merchandise licensees but it was difficult to still get the price competitive as we order low volumes, but any product we can add and retail for which there is demand we will do so, please feel free to nominate items you think would sell.	
11	Replica Parts	
	D.Robins gave a report that current parts inventory sits at \$1789.47, with the majority still supported on a consignment basis from himself and Mike Meyers.	
***************************************	The Chapter has procured and stocking items such as pilot motor rain traps and spark plugs previously supplied on consignment.	
	D.Hagen provided a 3D printed resin Ensign BEV carburettor housing sample at the meeting and is looking at potential of getting them printed in stainless.	
	G.Slocombe reminded all that the policy of the Chapter is to only seek to provide replica parts for those parts nolonger serviced by Caterpillar and where available we should continue to order from Cat to ensure ongoing demand and genuine supply.

	M.Hutchings advised that the committee had agreed to focus on 5 key events for 2025 to attend, with a 'standard base display' to travel to these from which then other members can choose to attend. All types of Cat machines new or old will be welcome.	
	In order to understand what tractors will be at what rally, the Chapter will, if you pre-register via the Chapter provide you with a limited edition professional printed 100 year spec display board. Details will be advised closer to rally dates.

Honorary member induction.

M.Hutchings read the following announcement to induct Daryl Marshall to the Chapter Honour board. Congratulations Daryl!

Tonight's recipient of the Chapter 19 Honor Board nomination is a Man well known to most long serving Caterpillar Collectors, Purchasing his first vintage Caterpillar machine in 1980. The yellow bug had bitten hard with a career of collecting treasures that would see him amass a collection of over 50+ items, mostly cat with a few wheeled items to keep him grounded. Always on the hunt sniffing around clearing sales and alike he seemed to have a knack for finding the yellow ones, he seemed to be able to get his hands on tractors that even the local collectors couldn't find, with one mutual friend saying, 'he can smell them from Moyston'. Of course, tonight we've chosen to Honor none other than the Mayor of Moyston. Darvl Marshall. Trying to gather up some information for this presentation proved to be harder than I thought, but with a little help I managed to dig up a little dirt if you like with a few kind words from a fellow collector and friend Howard Hillerman. I first met Daryl during the 80s, I was raking up some mallee that we had chained with a D8 which Darvl had sniffed out and came along for a look, he has a very good nose for such things!! He certainly had a knack for finding a cat at work which I'm sure Steve Shannon would confirm. One of our early escapades was to load an R5 onto Daryl's truck. We would need the help of my 944 loader for the job and when I asked where we were going, not far was the reply from Daryl. Turns out it was driving distance for the loader, and I didn't even know it was there. Weve travelled far and wide collecting toys, from Queensland to south Australia even from right under my nose and our rally trips have been great to, across to Western Australia and Queensland into NSW and even Clydesdale Country at Corryong. Daryl inspired me to Join ACMOC 29 Years ago and we continue to have a great time whenever were together, usually around a Cat or to. For those of you who don't know, Daryl and his wife Anne along with son Rob and family run a farm in the foothills of the Grampians near Moyston. Daryl's collection started with a Holt 5 ton in 1980, which is still the jewel in the crown and considered a favourite, being the oldest and rarest and also one of the only surviving Australian sold 5 tons left. Daryl's collection is not restricted to Cat, and also consists of early John Deere, McCormick and international tractors, the odd bulldog, Alice Chalmers and many other makes to fill the sheds. Bringing these machines back to life is a passion for Daryl and being able to present them in their working clothes is one of his favourite pastimes, although not always possible, sometimes the project calls for a little more and Daryl with Robs help always finish the job to the highest standard.

## Rob recalled some of their early retrievals, thinking to 13 himself not sure how long the 4-ton Bedford is going to last cont. on this job, as the D2s turned into D4s then D6s and 7s, but with plenty of helping hands we nearly always made it home. Daryl also spent some time as a councillor with the Ararat Shire, which served everyone at the local dealer William Adams very well as Caterpillar was a favourite whenever new equipment was being sort after. It gives me great pleasure to be able to add you to the Honor Board here at chapter 19 Daryl, its great to have a smiling face waiting for us in our shed at lake goldsmith, we look forward to many more years of great stories and smiling faces, and a little bit more of Annes scones and jelly slice. 14 Spill of all current committee positions M.Hutchings spilled the current 1- or 2-year terms that had been completed. #### Treasurer's report

2023/24 was a very prosperous and successful year for the Chapter, despite not be able to attend the May Lake Goldsmith rally with the merchandise stand. Attending the Diesel, Dirt & Turf exhibition in NSW to support Chapter 29 and dealer WesTrac, whilst a significant commitment in members time and personal finance expense for travel and hotels, was very fruitful for the Chapter and exposed the Club to a newer and much wider audience. Revenue of \$39,919.18 was down slightly by \$839.69 (2%) from last year, predominantly due to the extraordinary donation of \$15,000 towards 2025 projects in the prior year, which was matched by a donation of \$5000 in the current year.

Despite our best efforts we were unable to secure access to any of the last remaining ACMOC store merchandise from the USA, so increased focus was made to procure and create additional licensed line items and a wider range of models and toys to attract impulse buyers, particularly parents of children. This focus resulted in a significant increase of merchandise sales of \$17,650.00 up \$6,902.13 (64%) on prior year reflecting the hard work and dedication to attend rallies with the merchandise tent.

Replica parts revenue was up slightly to \$7,611.00 (9%) and continues to be a staple for the Chapter, however we are now starting to deplete the stocks held by Mike Meyer and Daryl Robins, so need to continue to look for ways to add to this list as it is an important member service.

The increased revenue and cash flow allowed the Chapter to make significant investments in merchandise stock in preparation for 2025 and prepare for other expenses in this the centenary year for Caterpillar.

I'm pleased to report the Chapter made an overall profit for the year of \$12,479.68 against a loss of \$258.47 in the prior year.

When considering revenue activities of the Chapter, merchandise sales generated \$6,270.13 @ 35% gross profit, which is a improvement on prior year. Replica parts generating \$1,814.95 @ 31% gross profit excluding the impact of merchant fees (Square Credit Card and PayPal).

Trading expenses were well managed, and we fully recovered direct costs associated with managing membership payments of behalf of the Club although much less activity was experienced in this space as members migrate to the new online payment system. A small profit of \$78 was generated due to positive exchange rate variance on memberships and our tail seat high tea auction raised \$495.

This year we collected NHMA insurance dues from 46 ACMOC members that will be paid on their behalf to NHMA in the 2024/25 financial year. This is done on a cost recovery basis and no profit is realised on providing this service to members.

As at June 30, 2024 we had unrestricted cash funds of \$21,550.23 available, as well as a surplus of \$1,173.09 in our PAYPAL account which continues to hold the Chapter in a healthy financial state.

Thank you to William Adams accountants for their assistance in preparation and review of the Chapters accounts this year.
